

REGULATIONS AND RULES OF PLAY
FOR
LEVEL III AND SENIORS LEAGUES
OF THE
JEFFERSON COUNTY JUNIOR BASEBALL LEAGUE

(January 2012)

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INTRODUCTION

The following Regulations and Rules of Play have been adopted by the Jefferson County Junior Baseball League. Should any situation arise which is not explicitly covered by these Regulations and Rules of Play, final authority shall fall upon, in the following order, the President of the Jefferson County Junior Baseball League (JCJBL), the Vice President of the JCJBL, the Director of Level III/Seniors of the JCJBL.

Area, as used in these Regulations and Rules of Play, refers to the member Area organization whose name and boundaries are delineated in the League's Bylaws (Article III, Paragraph A).

I. REGULATIONS

A. Player Enrollment

1. Every prospective Level III/Seniors player shall register with their respective "home" Area at such time and place as shall be designated by that Area.

B. Player Eligibility

1. To be eligible to play in the Jefferson County Junior Baseball League Level III, a player must be in the 9th or 10th grade, or in 8th grade and ineligible due to age restrictions to play in a JCJBL 14 year old league, during the current season and attend one of the member Area High Schools. EXCEPTION: Teams consisting of home schooled players, regardless of their grade level, may participate in Level III with the approval of the Level III Director.
2. To be eligible to play in the Jefferson County Junior Baseball League Seniors, a player must be no older than 18 year of age on April 30 of the current year and register through one of the member Areas. EXCEPTION: Any graduating senior shall be eligible to participate regardless of age.
3. A player shall play on a team fielded by his/her respective High School within one of the JCJBL member Areas with the following exceptions:
 - a. If the High School Area in which the player resides or attends school (the player's Home Area) does not field a the player shall be referred to any Area in which that player makes a team by the President of the player's Home Area.
4. Each team shall have a roster of eligible players prior to the first League game. This roster may be typewritten or computer generated; it may not be handwritten. A copy of each team's original roster and any properly amended rosters shall be on file with the Level III/Seniors Director and the JCJBL office and shall contain the following:
 - a. The title - "Official Level III Roster" for "The Jefferson County Junior Baseball League".
 - b. The date of the roster.
 - c. The team name, Area, and JCJBL team league classification.
 - d. A list of players giving their last name, first name, birth date, grade level, street address, zip code, phone number, and uniform number.
 - e. The head coach's name, address, zip code, and phone number.
5. The Roster must be signed and dated by the Area president or designated Area board officer.
6. Any variation from the above requirements for an official roster must have prior approval of the Level III Director.
7. Any amended rosters shall be filed with the Level III Director and the JCJBL office prior to that roster becoming that team's official roster. If an amended roster is not provided, the roster originally provided to the opposing coach shall be considered the official roster, and all players not on the original roster shall be considered ineligible. Any protest involving this Regulation must be lodged before the end of the game and shall be submitted to and approved by the Protest Committee before this penalty can be imposed.
8. Violation of any of the following Regulations shall result in all players involved being declared ineligible to participate in JCJBL play for at least the current season and post-season tournament play:
 - a. Players shall not be transferred from one roster to another roster after the start of scheduled play.
 - b. Player movement from Level III to any other High School level is permitted. Any player movement from a high school roster to a Level III roster must be approved by the Level III Director..
 - c. Players shall not concurrently be rostered or play on two or more JCJBL teams.
9. The penalty for playing an ineligible player shall be forfeiture of any and all games in which the ineligible player participated. A protest must be submitted to and approved by the Protest Committee before the penalty can be imposed. The Protest Committee will review the protest for any mitigating circumstances that might have caused the coach to unknowingly play an ineligible player. If the Protest Committee finds no mitigating circumstances, the coach in charge of that game shall be suspended for 365 days from all aspects of JCJBL.
10. Verification of player eligibility may be requested only by the opposing coach.

C. Coaches

1. Coaches shall be supplied by the Areas for each of their Level III/Seniors teams.
2. A player's school eligibility is to be safeguarded at all times. No coach, by his actions, shall cause such eligibility to be jeopardized. The penalty for a coach causing school ineligibility of a player shall be suspension of the coach from any further coaching in the Jefferson County Junior Baseball League. The League Board of Directors must agree, by a majority vote, that a violation of this Regulation has been committed.
3. Each member area must annually obtain an application from and run a background check on every head coach and all assistant coaches.

D. Method of Paying Umpires

1. Method of paying umpires for each season shall be established by the Board of Directors.

E. Games

1. Insofar as possible, the schedule of League games shall be so constructed that home games shall be played on a field of the home team Area.
2. Any game played prior to the official starting date will be classified as a practice or scrimmage game and therefore has no official status for League standing or eligibility for entry in tournaments of any kind.
3. All games shall be scheduled with a minimum of two (2) umpires and shall be played with a minimum of one (1) umpire under contract with JCJBL for the current season, working the entire game. Games played with volunteer umpire(s), even with the consent of both opposing coaches, will not be considered official games, and if not re-scheduled will be disavowed.

F. Playing Fields

1. Each Area shall have their playing fields smoothed, lined, and ready for play well in advance of game time for all scheduled games played in their Area. Home team coaches shall make certain this responsibility is met.
2. For rescheduled, make up of postponements, or continued play of suspended games, the coach of the home team shall be responsible to ensure that necessary arrangements are made to have the field in playing condition even though the game may be played on a neutral field.
3. The home team, for each League game, shall be responsible for furnishing the bases and pitcher's rubber, and for marking the field.

G. League Structure

1. An Area may bracket as many teams as it wishes. League structure, number of games, and season start and end dates will be determined each year by the Level III/Seniors Director, President and Vice President.
2. JCJBL will assess bracketing fees to teams. Each Area will be responsible for the fees assessed to their teams.
3. Any teams from outside JCJBL boundaries wishing to participate in JCJBL Level III/Seniors must have approval of the Level III/Seniors Director.

H. Scorekeepers

1. The Scorekeeper for the League shall be the office employee of the League.
2. Duties of the Scorekeeper:
 - a. To maintain records of the results of all official games of the League.
3. Powers of the Scorekeeper
 - a. To declare, with the approval of the Level III Director, that a game is a disavowed game, resulting in a loss for both teams, provided that:
 1. The game in question has, in fact, been played to completion and;
 2. The outcome of the game in question has not been reported in a timely fashion and;
 3. Both teams involved in an unreported score have been notified by the Scorekeeper that the result of a game has not been reported. Upon notification that a game has not been reported, the teams involved shall have a maximum of twenty-four (24) hours to report the score of the game in question.
 - b. The Scorekeeper of the League is not required to disavow any non-reported game. However, the disavowal of any game by the Scorekeeper and the Level III Director shall be final, and no appeal shall be allowed, heard, nor ruled on by the League Officers or Board of Directors.

I. Methods of Reporting Game Scores

1. Teams shall follow scorekeeping procedures as outlined by the JCJBL Board of Directors prior to the start of the season. Both teams are required to report scores of all games played.

J. Conflict between Regulations and Rules of Play

1. In case of conflict between these REGULATIONS and the RULES OF PLAY, the REGULATIONS shall hold precedence.

K. Behavior and Sportsmanship

1. Player/Parent Agreement: In an effort to educate parents, players, and coaches on their roles and responsibilities as they pertain to positive support in youth sports, and to hold participants accountable for their

actions, a Player/Parent Agreement form will be required with signatures of all players, parents and coaches participating in JCJBL. The form is one per team and is to be attached to and submitted with the team roster prior to the start of League play.

2. Pre-Game Sportsmanship Announcements: As part of every pre-game meeting at home plate (umpires and coaches) there will be a mandatory reading of a Code of Ethics statement.

3. Disciplinary Action

a. Level III/Seniors – Player/Coach/Parent Ejection. If during a game an umpire ejects a Player(s), Coach(s), Parent(s), and/or Spectator(s) the following steps must be followed:

1. Umpire reports the ejection via game report within 24 hours citing reason for ejection. Failure of umpire to report ejection is forfeiture of game pay.
2. The Head Coach must contact his/her Area President within 24 hours of the start of the game and the ejected person must serve an automatic one game suspension for the next scheduled league game. This one game suspension is automatic and cannot be appealed. If a parent or spectator is ejected, it is still the head coach's responsibility to contact his/her Area President within the stated time limit and the parent/spectator will also follow the automatic one game suspension.
3. Area President will investigate the ejection using the umpire ejection report, contacting witnesses, obtain police reports, etc. and forward to the JCJBL Director within 48 hours from the start of the game in which the ejection took place. If the Area President or his designee has not investigated within the time limits required, the JCJBL Director will complete the investigation and the coach may not participate in any JCJBL League games until the JCJBL Director completes the investigation.
1. JCJBL Director and Area President will decide on further discipline, if necessary. Communication with the ejected person will be via email and US Mail with copies provided to the Area President and the JCJBL office.

4. Penalty Guidelines:

b. Reprimand - An official letter to the individual and/or the member area concerned in regards to offense committed and warning against further acts of a detrimental nature that are contrary to the aims and philosophies of the JCJBL. This letter will become part of the permanent file of the individual and/or member area involved.

c. Probation - An act, which formally notifies member areas that it, or any of its representatives, have been in serious violation of JCJBL rules, policies, or philosophy. Additional violations while on probation will be considered extremely serious and could lead to restriction or suspension. Periods of probation may vary.

1. Removal from Probation - A request for removal from probation is to be initially routed through the League Director and all such requests be forwarded by a member area President. The request is to outline the constructive action taken by the member area and ensuing acceptance by the individual to prevent a re-occurrence in seeking removal from probationary status.

2. Added Review - Those situations, which in the League Directors opinion, have not demonstrated constructive action, will be forwarded to the Disciplinary Committee for a personal appearance by the member area President and the individual in question. By this means, an appearance before the Disciplinary Committee would truly carry the intent of a major review and thus create an atmosphere of cooperation in an effort to eliminate such circumstances.

d. Restriction - Action, which would restrict participation in JCJBL activities. Restriction may apply to an individual or to a team. Upon removal of the restriction, the individual or team shall be placed on probation.

e. Suspension - The effect of a suspension shall be to prohibit participation in any or all JCJBL activities. The levels of suspension for disciplinary action are as follows:

1. Level One - Restriction to the dugout
2. Level Two - One game suspension (not including current game)
3. Level Three - Three game suspension (not including current game)
4. Level Four - One year suspension
5. Level Five - Lifetime suspension

5. Disciplinary Committee: In an effort to incorporate consistency when addressing behavior issues in the JCJBL, the Disciplinary Committee, consisting of a rotating group of Area Presidents, shall be responsible for responding to appeals pertaining to disciplinary actions. The organizing chairman is the affected League Director. The Appeals Committee Chairman shall be a League Director different than the affected one.

- a. Game Suspension Appeals are handled by following the guidelines listed below:
 1. Request an appeal in writing to the JCJBL League Director via e-mail or hand delivered letter within 48 hours of your suspension.
 2. Include the incidents leading up to the ejection, what actions did you take after the ejection was given, witness letters, police reports, etc. and why you do not agree with the suspension given over and above the automatic one game suspension. NOTE that the automatic one game suspension is not a discipline that can be appealed, it is not negotiable.
 3. A Director other than the affected one shall chair the committee with a panel of rotating area presidents, excluding the affected area president will be asked to sit in on the appeal hearing. The Appeal hearing will be held within 72 hours of the additional discipline handed down by the Area President and JCJBL Director at an area designated by the JCJBL League Director.
 4. Appeal hearing attendees are limited to the following: Coach/Parent/Spectator ejected; the Area President or designee; affected JCJBL Director; Umpire and/or umpire committee representative; and the Disciplinary Committee. No further people will be allowed to attend however the committee will accept witness letters, e-mails, police reports, etc.
 5. The discipline handed down by the Disciplinary Committee will be final and no further appeals will be allowed.

6. Miscellaneous Information

- a. Disciplinary action enforced by any JCJBL affiliation (e.g. - USSSA, AABC) that would carry over to post-season play will be recognized by the JCJBL.
- b. Post-game violence is subject to disciplinary action by the JCJBL.
- c. If disciplinary action enforced by any member area is stricter than that of the JCJBL, the JCJBL will recognize the member area's action.
- d. All behavioral issues adopted by the JCJBL will be discussed in detail at the initial League coaches meetings.

II. RULES OF PLAY

The Official Baseball Rules as used in these Rules of Play shall refer to the National Federation of State High School Association Baseball Rules, latest revised edition.

The Official Baseball Rules shall apply for all League games with the exceptions defined by the exceptions that follow and as modified and amended by these Regulations and Rules of Play. In cases of conflict between the Official Baseball Rules and these Regulations and Rules of Play, the Regulations and Rules of Play shall hold precedence.

A. Exceptions to the National Federation of State High Schools Baseball Rules

1. An exception to the Official Baseball Rules shall be that all games shall be subject to a time limit of two hours, fifteen minutes (2:15). Any inning in progress when the time limit occurs shall be completed, unless the home team is at bat and leading. The end of a game shall be defined by first, this time limit, and second, by the completion of six and one-half or seven innings, as the case may be. The only exception to the time limit is in the event of a tie game, in which the game must be played to completion.

Note: The start of any new inning is specifically defined as the precise instant that the third out of the bottom half of any inning is called by an umpire. The starting time of any game is as determined by the umpire-in-chief, and may or may not correspond to the starting time in the schedules of games.

2. There shall be no restrictions on player/coach contact days. (e.g. games and/or practices may be conducted any day of the week.)
3. There shall be no restrictions on practice start dates and/or tryout dates.
4. Teams may be required to play more than one (1) game per day.

5. An exception to Official Baseball rules shall be that games can be played on fields without pitching mounds.
6. Before each game the coach of each team will be required to establish a batting order. The batting order may consist of NINE (9) starters (DH would be allowed) and the rest of the players listed as substitutes OR may consist of every player on the roster (bat the entire lineup) and which would remain unchanged for the entire game. Free substitution in the field would be permitted with the batting the entire lineup option where as any player could replace any other player in the field at any time during the game without restriction except where it would violate the rules governing the eligibility and re-substitution of pitchers. If a player starts the game and then becomes unable to continue due to injury or illness, or if a player is ejected from the game, that player's position in the batting order will be skipped. There is no penalty for skipping this player however he is no longer eligible to play in that game. If, during the resumption of a suspended or postponed game, all the players in the original line-up are not present, the spot in the batting order of the player(s) not present shall be skipped with no penalty. Those players NOT on the original line-up are eligible to play in a resumed game and shall be added to the bottom of the line-up.
7. When a team is batting it's entire line-up the team is allowed two courtesy runners for the pitcher and/or catcher and will utilize the last out recorded. With the batting 9 option, a non starting player must be used as the courtesy runner.

B. Postponed and Suspended Games

1. In the event a postponement occurs in the last two weeks of the regular season, no postponed game will be scheduled to be played following the completion of the regular season without the specific approval of the Level III/Seniors Director.
2. All postponements, except those for adverse weather conditions, must be recommended by the Area presidents and approved by the Level III/Seniors Director not later than 48 hours in advance of the scheduled game. (Exception: If both teams fail to field nine (9) eligible players within twenty (20) minutes after game time, the game shall be a double forfeit). Games shall not be postponed for the convenience of coaches, parents, and players during holidays and vacation periods. Ordinarily, the only acceptable reason for a postponement is when a scheduled game conflicts with another youth organization's activity, school activity, or church activity (excluding organized sports).
3. The home team shall be responsible for rescheduling a postponed or suspended game, providing a field, and arranging for umpires. The only reasons for not playing on an assigned date are if a team is already playing a JCJBL League game on that date. The penalty for lack of proper action in rescheduling shall be forfeiture of the game by either the home or visiting team. A protest must be submitted and approved by the Protest Committee before the penalty can be imposed.
4. The home team shall not, without agreement from the opposing coach, reschedule a postponed or rescheduled game:
 - a. on a holiday;
 - b. without two (2) days notice (e.g., a coach notified on Monday shall not have to play before Wednesday).
5. If a game is postponed without proper notice to the umpires the Area of the team at fault shall pay the umpire fees when the postponed game is played.

C. Forfeits

1. If a team fails to field nine (9) eligible players within twenty (20) minutes after the scheduled game time, the team failing to do so shall forfeit the game, and the game shall go into the records as such.

D. Conduct

1. Only uniformed members of the team, official coaches, official bat persons, official water persons, and one scorekeeper shall occupy the player's bench during the game.
2. Fighting that occurs on or near any playing field by players, coaches, spectators will not be tolerated: Penalties will be severe. Full reports on any situations will be reported to the President of JCJBL.
3. An umpire who ejects anyone from a game, or forfeits a game for any of the above reasons, must report, in writing, the reason for said ejection or forfeiture to the JCJBL President, the JCJBL Director of Umpires, and Level III/Seniors Director within 24 hours from the start of said game. In the event that a report is not made, the umpire shall forfeit his pay for that game.

NOTE: CHSAA, ARTICLE 22, CONDUCT/SPORTSMANSHIP RULES WHICH WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED:

2200.1

Any player who has been ejected from a match or contest shall be disqualified for the remainder of that match or contest. In addition, the player shall be ineligible for the next regularly scheduled match or contest of the same level.

2210.1

A coach ejected from a contest for committing an unsportsmanlike act shall be ineligible to coach for the next regularly scheduled match or contest of the same level.

2210.3

A coach ejected from a second contest during the same season shall be ineligible to coach for the next two contests of the same level.

4. JCJBL's Executive Board shall have the authority to suspend any JCJBL coach and or player for up to 365 days for any action deemed detrimental to the League.

E. Ground Rules

1. The coaches shall meet with the umpire at home plate five (5) minutes before game time to reach agreement on the ground rules.

F. Protests

1. Method of Protesting Alleged Regulation(s) Violations for League Games
 - a. The time limit for submitting a Regulation(s) based protest to the League Protest Director shall be no later than 24 hours after the completion of league play for the league classification that the protested team played in during league play. After this time, no Regulation(s) based protests will be allowed for League games. All Regulation(s) based protests must be submitted in writing.
 - b. No specific format for submitting Regulation(s) based protests is required. However, the protesting Area must include the following information as a part of its protest:
 1. \$50.00 protest fee.
 2. That the protest is Regulation(s) based.
 3. The specific JCJBL Regulation(s) allegedly violated.
 4. The date(s) and game number(s) that the Regulation(s) was (were) allegedly violated.
 5. The specific Area, team, coach, or player (as the case may be) allegedly violating a Regulation(s).
 - c. The Area president and the coach of the team that the protest was filed against shall be notified of the protest, in writing, by the protesting Area president, forwarding them a copy of the protest at the same time the protest is filed.
2. The Protest Committee for League games shall be as specified in the Bylaws of the League, which state, in part, that:
 - a. The Protest Director shall be an elected Officer of the League.
 - b. The Protest Committee shall be composed of the Protest Director and one other person appointed by the Protest Director.
 - c. The Protest Committee must rule on any and all protests received within seven (7) calendar days.
 - d. The Protest Committee must inform, by telephone, both Areas involved in any protest within two (2) calendar days following a ruling.
 - e. The protest Committee must inform, in writing, both Areas involved in any protest within seven (7) calendar days following a ruling.
3. Resolution of Protests for League Games
 - a. If a Regulation(s) protest is upheld, further action shall follow as specified in the JCJBL Level III/Seniors Regulations.
 - b. The League Protest Director shall then notify all involved Area presidents, the JCJBL Director of Umpires, and the Level III/Seniors Director and, if necessary, record the decision in the minutes of the next JCJBL meeting, and return the score sheets, if applicable, to the protesting community.

G. Game Time Restrictions

1. Restrictions for Evening or Night Games
 - a. Local parks may establish curfew regulations. It shall be the responsibility of the home team to cover these regulations as a part of the ground rules prior to the start of the game.
 - b. If, when a game is halted due to curfew, lack of light, weather, or any other unavoidable interference, the game shall be suspended and continued at a later date, unless 4 ½ innings if home team is leading or 5 innings if visiting team is leading at the time of the suspension.

- c. If the score is tied the game shall continue until the tie is broken. If a curfew regulation does not permit continuation, the game shall be suspended and continued at a later date.
- 2. A game may be postponed if play has not started within one hour of its scheduled starting time only if one of the following conditions is satisfied:
 - a. Playing of the game would jeopardize completion of any games scheduled after the game in question.
 - b. The game could not reasonably be expected to be completed due to local park curfew regulations
 - c. When playing on an unlighted field, the game could not reasonably be expected to be completed due to darkness.

The determination as to whether these condition(s) are met shall be the responsibility of the coach of the home team.

- 3. When play must be temporarily suspended for weather or any other unavoidable interference, the time lost shall not count as playing time.

H. Championship Tournament

- 1. A championship tournament shall be held at the end of the regular season.
- 2. Tournament play will begin on the date established by the Level III/Seniors Director and approved by the Board of Directors. Those teams involved in a late finishing date will be rescheduled in accordance with JCJBL regulations. The championship tournament will be completed in one day (weather permitting).
- 3. Upon review of league standings the scorekeeper will contact by telephone the coach of all teams in contention for a tournament berth, to provide all tournament information, prior to the start of tournament play.
- 4. JCJBL will provide a tournament champion team trophy and a tournament runner-up team trophy.
- 5. The tournament host Area will provide lined and playable fields.
- 6. The JCJBL Umpire Director will make arrangements for three umpires for each game. The Level III/Seniors Director will provide the Umpire Director with the tournament game schedule as early as possible and a telephone call will be made to the Umpire Director prior to the start of tournament play to confirm the assignment of umpires.
- 7. The Level III/Seniors Director shall be responsible for reprimanding any spectators or teams for unsportsmanlike conduct, but this shall not preclude nor interfere with the umpires' right to do so.
- 8. JCJBL will provide game baseballs. Following the game, the balls shall be given to each team, except that the championship game balls shall be given to the winning coach.
- 9. The cost to Areas for the championship tournament shall be invoiced prior to the start of the season, and shall be included in bracketing fees that are assessed, based on the following:
 - a. Cost of umpires shall be determined by the JCJBL Treasurer.
 - b. Cost of trophies and programs shall be determined by the JCJBL Tournament Director.
- 10. If a game is suspended due to weather and/or curfew, the game shall resume, at a later date, exactly at the point of suspension and played the total number of innings for that game to be completed. No tournament games will be won or lost due to time or weather conditions.
- 11. There is no time limit for the championship game.
- 12. No team qualifying for the JCJBL tournament may participate in any other concurrent tournament.
- 13. League games that are suspended or postponed that were scheduled during the last 7 days of league play may be played only if:
 - a. One or both teams have a chance to earn a berth in the tournament.
 - b. Only the day after the end of league play may be used for those specified games unless approved by the Level III/Seniors Director.
 - c. More than one game but not more than two games may be played during this day.
 - d. The home team for the game, or games, shall be responsible for obtaining umpires and playing fields.
- 14. In the event of ties in league positions where two (2) or more teams are involved and only one or two tournament slots are available, the Level III/Seniors Director will fill these slots using the following methods:
 - a. 2 teams (one slot) - head to head record.
 - b. 3 teams (one slot) - team with highest winning percentage among the league games played between the three tied teams earns slot. If all three teams have an identical winning percentage among league games played between the three tied teams then the team with the least amount of runs allowed between the tied teams earns the slot.
 - c. There are many combinations that could possibly arise, but the Level III/Seniors Director, using the above guidelines, should be able to bracket the tournament and still remain fair to the majority of teams concerned. There will be no special play-off games.
- 15. The tournament shall be invitational in nature and shall be organized as follows:
 - a. The tournament shall be conducted on a single elimination basis.
 - b. With multiple divisions or 11 or more teams, the top two teams from each division shall be invited.
 - c. With only one division or 10 or fewer teams, the top four teams shall be invited.

- d. When a team declines an invitation to participate in the JCJBL Championship Tournament, that invitation is automatically extended to the next highest place team in that league classification.
 - e. Seeding shall be determined by the Level III/Seniors Director based upon final league standings.
16. The 10-run rule (mercy rule) applied for all games.
 17. ANY PLAYER OR COACH EJECTED FROM A SEMI-FINAL GAME IS INELIGIBLE FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME.
 18. The respective League Champions will be the home teams for the semi-finals. A coin-toss will determine the home team for the Championship game.

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
